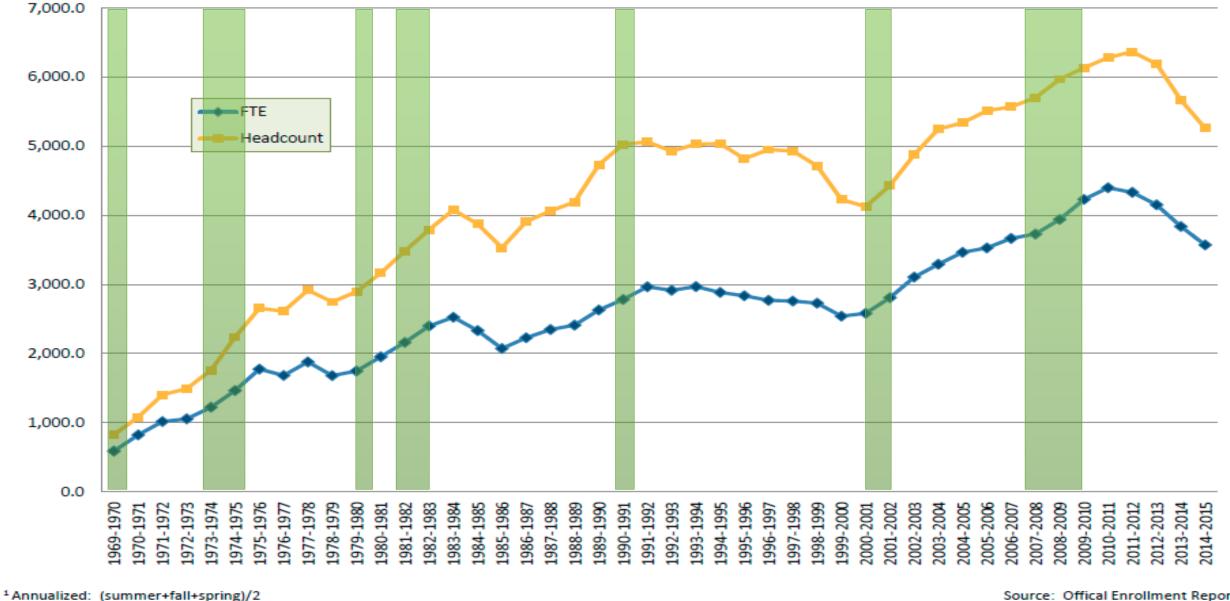


Incoming and Outgoing



Laramie County Community College Annualized¹ Enrollment History

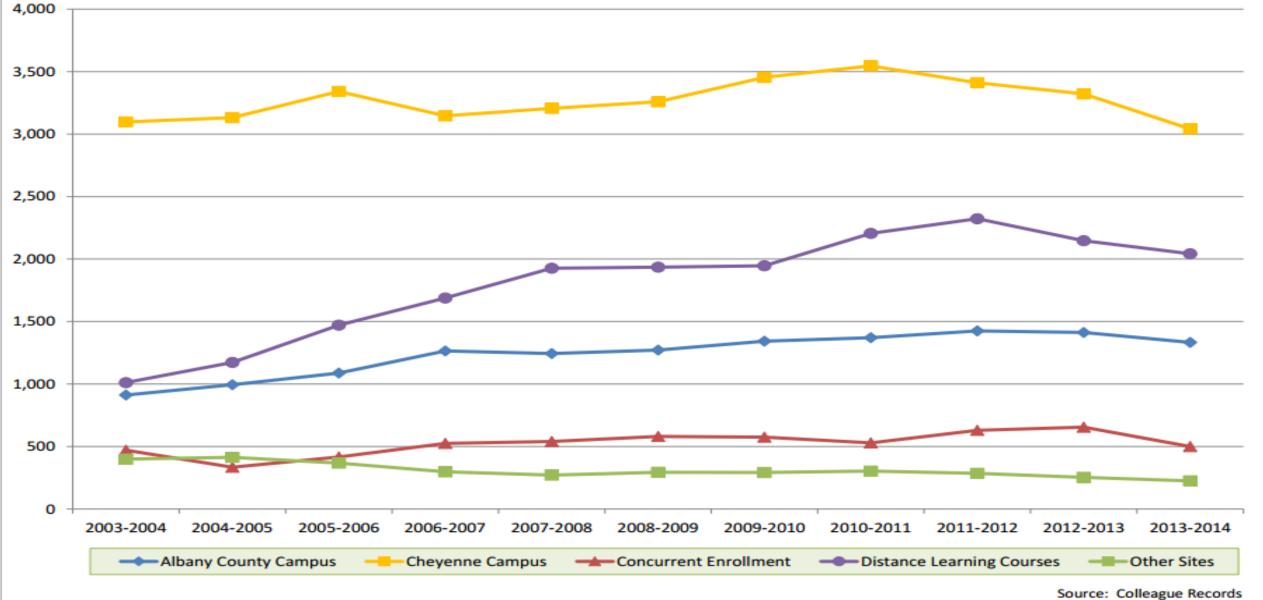

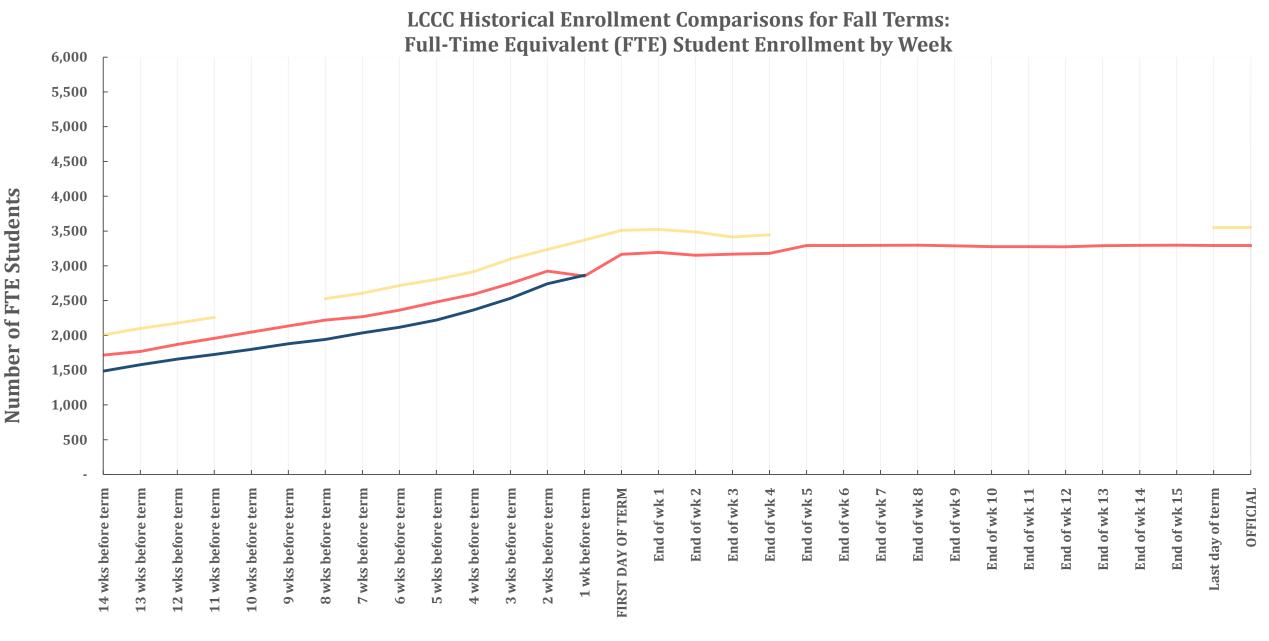

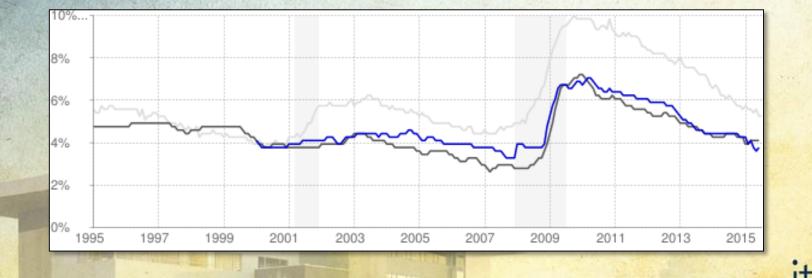

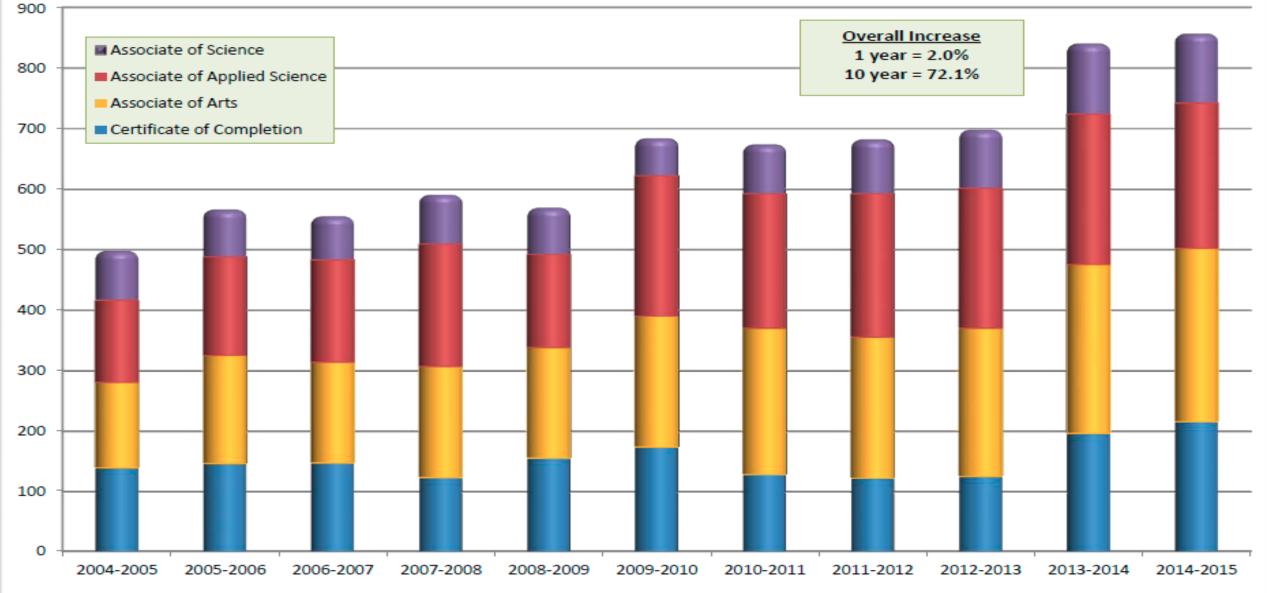

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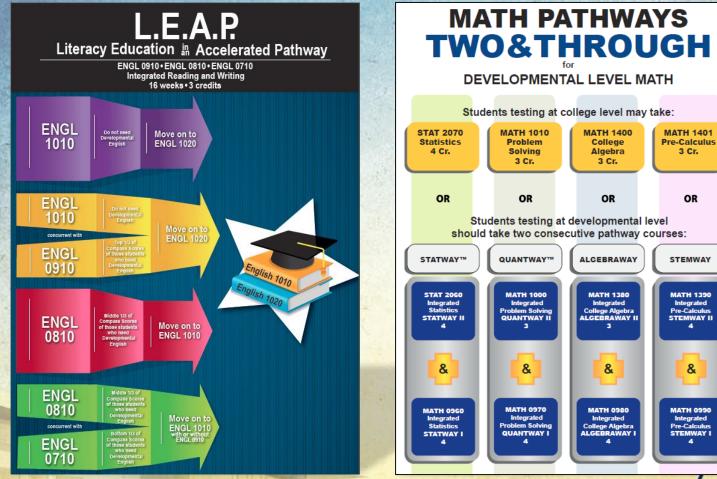
