

# **RESPONSE TO FUNDING ISSUES**

- WCCC has increased tuition 8 times over 10 years.
- Colleges have had to increase student fees to support students.
- Colleges have increased course fees to address educational supplies and equipment needs.
- Colleges have cut budgets, eliminated programs and services, in some cases multiple times.
- Colleges have eliminated positions through attrition and layoffs.





# WHAT IS GUIDED PATHWAYS?

A research-based framework for redesigning the college to improve the student experience from entry through graduation.

Students are more likely to complete if they:

- Choose a program and develop an academic plan early on;
   Have a clear road map of the courses they need to take to complete a credential; and
- 3. Receive guidance and support to help them stay on plan.





# **BAS APPROVAL TIMELINES**

- March 2019 State Legislature passes legislation (SF111).
- July 23, 2019 WCCC holds BAS planning session with HLC.
- Aug 21, 2019 LCCC BOT passes resolution. Authorizes to proceed.
- Aug 28, 2019 WCCC receives request to proceed with a BAS.
- Sept 11, 2019 LCCC BOT approves BAS programs.
- Oct 24, 2019 WCCC approves LCCC's proposed BAS programs.
- Jan 27 & 28 HLC Site Visit to LCCC
- March-ish HLC Decision on Approval



# WHAT WILL HLC/WCCC EXPECT?

- We can show how these programs align with our Mission.
- We can demonstrate an identified need.
- We can show that leadership supports these changes.
- We can identify how and where upper-division education differs.
  - What we expect from student competency and ability

- We can show that we have had broad conversations on campus about adding these programs.
- We can demonstrate that faculty have been the primary individuals developing the programs.

- Oh, and we're kinda experts in applied learning.






