Spring 2017 Tuition Increase and Revenue Loss

Tuition was increased beginning with the Spring 2017 semester to help offset the costs of the swim classes and a part-time, benefited instructor (became part-time, benefited Spring 2015). In spite of the increased class cost, the water classes still experienced a revenue loss in Spring 2017 due to the closure of the pool in April for boiler repair, which meant classes had to be cancelled. In addition, even though classes were cancelled during this time, the instructor still had to be paid for the cancelled classes because of her part-time, benefited status.

13 students X \$20 = \$260 - 12 students enrolled under the Golden Age Privilege and were non-degree seeking; 1 student was an employee and paid the employee cost of \$10/credit plus the \$10 lab fee.

2 students X \$152.75 = \$305.50 - Both students were non-degree seeking and paid the actual course cost.

1 student X \$199.75 = \$199.75 – The student paid the out-of-state cost and was degree-seeking.

AY 2015, 2016, and 2017 Pool Usage by Credit Classes

In AY 2015, 2016, and 2017, 29 students (41% of all swimming students) enrolled more than once. These 29 students account for 104 (70%) of the total enrollments during 2015, 2016, 2017. [LCCC IR Office, AMM, 11/27/17]

- Eighteen students were seniors who had 76 total enrollments under the Golden Age Privilege (\$10/credit hour plus a \$10 lab fee).
- Three of these students are current LCCC employees, and one is an employee's spouse. These four individuals represent 11 total enrollments.
- Ten students enrolled in PEAC 1012 Beginning Swimming at least twice, and three of these enrolled in this course three times.
- Eighteen students enrolled in PEAC 2011 Intermediate Swimming at least twice in the three-year period; five of these students enrolled in this course at least three times.
 - o One student enrolled in this course every semester from Spring 2016 thru Fall 2017.
- Twenty-five students enrolled in both PEAC 1012 and PEAC 2011 during the same semester.
