Subject: Proposed Credentials, Wyoming Highway Patrol

The Guided Pathways initiative at the College has created a deep examination of our academic offerings. This examination has challenged us to ensure our programs adhere to the tenets of the Pathways framework in supporting our students' success. Specifically, the College has committed to offering academic programs that are clear and intentional in design to meet students' goals in employment or further education. It is with respect for these tenets that I seek approval for three new credentials, developed in partnership with the Wyoming Highway Patrol. Each of the proposed programs has completed the required development and review process and has received approval of the Academic Standards Committee.

PROGRAMS' OVERVIEW:

LCCC, the Wyoming Department of Transportation, and the Wyoming Highway Patrol (WHP) announced a new partnership in November 2019. To date that partnership has included a visible presence of the WHP staff members and cadets on the Cheyenne campus as well as limited recognition through academic credit for the accomplishments of those cadets in required pre-service training. The proposed WHP Basic Academy Credit Diploma (CD) and Wyoming Highway Patrol Academy CD programs will formalize, through academic credentials, the achievements of the cadets as they prepare for employment with the WHP. The proposed Patrol Peace Officer Associate of Applied Science program provides two additional semesters of academic work on a path to the AAS degree.

WHP Basic Academy CD

The Basic Academy CD is a closed program encompassing basic training for students preparing for careers as patrol officers. Admission to the program is restricted to cadets who have been accepted by and enrolled in the WHP academy. The coursework in this program was previously delivered at training sites in Douglas and Guernsey and is currently being delivered at the College by WHP personnel. This proposal seeks to package the instruction into a recognized credential that comprehensively defines achievement of the Basic Academy.

WHP Academy CD

The WHP Academy CD is delivered following the Basic Academy and finalizes the career preparation for students wishing to serve as patrol officers. This closed program encompasses the instruction specific to patrol positions in the WHP. Similar to that in the Basic Academy the coursework in the WHP Academy CD was formerly delivered in Douglas and Guernsey. As a result of the College's partnership with the WHP this instruction will be delivered on our Cheyenne campus by WHP staff members. The CD proposal seeks to define the instruction as credit-bearing via the College's structure for course numbering, course competencies, and course content. The proposal further seeks to package that instruction into a recognized credential.

Patrol Peace Officer AAS

The Patrol Peace Officer program is limited to cadets accepted by and enrolled in the WHP Academy. The first two semesters of this program will include the coursework required for the Basic Academy and the WHP Academy CD. Year two of this program is designed to meet the general education requirements for all AAS degrees at LCCC and includes coursework that is broadly available throughout the academic year. The AAS provides a path for academy students who wish to prepare for careers as patrol peace officers. Successful completion of the AAS further provides the path to the Bachelor of Applied Science degree in Applied Management.

PROGRAMS' OUTCOMES:

WHP Basic Academy CD

The Basic Academy Credit Diploma is comprised of 18 credits and has been designed as a 1-semester program.

Upon successful completion of the CD students will be able to:

- 1. Explain the U.S. and Wyoming criminal justice systems and laws
- 2. Develop teamwork through collaboration
- 3. Demonstrate critical thinking in practical and theoretical problems specific to the day-to-day operations of a Peace Officer
- 4. Develop decision making processes used in Law Enforcement
- 5. Explain ethical standards specific to the day-to-day operations of a Peace Officer
- 6. Identify cultural differences within communities
- 7. Justly enforce the law in the State of Wyoming
- 8. Demonstrate the skills required for a cadet completing the basic law enforcement academy
