





COVID-19 Relief

Student Emergency Aid Grants



LCCC Emergency CARES Grant Spring/Summer 2020

- Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act
 - Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF I)
- For financial hardships related to disruption of campus operations including eligible expenses under a student's cost of attendance
- \$751,327 CARES Grants were distributed to 564 students
 - > Average grant award of \$1,332



CARES Wyoming Grants - Fall 2020

- Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act
 - Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund (GEERF)

CARES Wyoming Adult Grant

- Adults age 25 64 who are unemployed or underemployed due to COVID-19
- \$269,044 grants distributed to 142 students
 - > Average grant award of \$1,895

CARES Wyoming College Grant

- Housing and meals
- \$2,264,737 grants distributed to 732 students
 - > Average grant award of \$3,094



TOTAL WYOMING CARES GRANTS = \$2,533,781 to 874 students

LCCC COVID-19 Emergency Grant Spring 2021

- Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA)
 - Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF II)
- For any component of the student's cost-of-attendance or for emergency costs related to Coronavirus
- Priority given to students with exceptional need
- \$751,327 CRRSAA Grants were distributed to 1,081 students
 - > Average grant award of \$695



Student Emergency Aid Grants

Total amount allocated from Spring 2020 to Spring 2021

\$4,036,435

More on the way...

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021

- Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III (HEERF III)
- LCCC's student grant allocation will be \$3,058,454
- Waiting on funding and additional guidance from the US Department of Education

LCCC Summer Award

- Funded by LCCC Bookstore Account
- \$100,337 available for Summer 2021 scholarships
- Funds up to 6 credits of tuition, fees, and books less any gift aid the student is receiving
- Maximum award value
 - Wyoming resident students = \$1,190
 - Non-resident students = \$2,375
 - **WUE students = \$1,480**



Financial Aid

- Total Aid Volume
 - > 20/21 = \$14,294,510 to date
 - > 19/20 = \$14,016,256
 - > 18/19 = \$13,245,998

Commencement

Provisionally approved graduation applications as of May 10:

- 20/FA
 - 223 students earned 232 credentials
- 21/SP1 Dental Hygiene
 - 11 students earned 11 credentials*
- 21/SP
 - 355 students earning 380 credentials
- 21/SU
 - 14 students earning 14 credentials
