- Freely available for use, reuse, adaptation and sharing



Why OER?

- Faculty do not have to reinvent the wheel
- Faculty can retain more control
- Direct cost-savings for students
- Students have required materials from day one



Student Outcomes

- Higher success rates
- Attain more credits when they are enrolled in OER courses
- Students respond favorably to OER

Textbook Costs

- Costs have risen at 3 times inflation since 1970
- 65% of students sometimes skip buying textbooks
- Food insecure students
 - 82% have not bought textbooks
 - 38% reported not buying access codes



Changes to Publishing Landscape

1. Access Codes

Publishers recognized need to add value: Homework platforms, LMS integration, etc.



2. "Inclusive access"

Automatic billing systems
Costs folded into tuition and fees








VP of Academic Affairs approved funding
