Subject: New Program Proposal, Practical Nursing

As a result of our Guided Pathways initiative the College has committed to offering academic programs that are clear and intentional in design to meet students' goals in employment or further education. This commitment is emphasized in the LCCC Strategic Plan 2030. Goal 3 of that plan recognizes the unmet need for qualified employees in many of Wyoming's healthcare occupations and identifies capacity for growth in the School of Health Science & Wellness. It is with respect for the Guided Pathways tenets, the strategic planning of the College, and the employee demands of our region that I seek approval for a new credential, the Practical Nurse Certificate to begin delivery in the Fall 2024 semester.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The Practical Nursing program represents the expansion of programming in our School of Health Science & Wellness (HSW). This expansion aligns with our Strategic Plan and has received financial support from the Wyoming Innovation Partnership (WIP).

Staffing shortages of licensed care professionals like Practical Nurses continues to grow toward a critical high nationwide and especially in underserved states like Wyoming. A stand-alone Practical Nurse (PN) program presents the opportunity for more students to secure training and seek employment in this critical occupation.

This program is designed for students who seek the LPN as the next step in their educational and professional journeys. The program will be delivered in a stand-alone hybrid format that pairs online didactic instruction with a regular bi-semester residency requirement on the LCCC campus in Cheyenne. This programming will span three semesters and will be completed in the final semester with a required capstone clinical experience that can be completed in the student's home community. The LPN is a critical healthcare worker in long-term care facilities, hospitals, public health, home health, and private practices. It provides for a life-sustaining wage as well as an on-ramp to additional training and careers in healthcare for those who seek it.

PROGRAM OUTCOMES:

The program has completed the required development and review process and has received approval of the Academic Standards Committee. The Certificate is comprised of 48 credits. The 3-semester program sequence was developed for full-time students.

Upon successful completion of the Certificate, students will be able to:

- 1. Provide safe care within the healthcare system.
- 2. Incorporate prior knowledge, current research, and clinical experience in decision-making.
- 3. Demonstrate leadership skills as part of an inter-professional team to promote desired outcomes.
- 4. Use effective communication and advocacy to provide individualized care.
- 5. Practice within the core values, principles, and standards of the nursing profession.
- 6. Utilize the nursing process and a broad knowledge base to maximize health.

Students will have the opportunity to meet these outcomes through the following program sequence:

STAFFING IMPACT:

The PN program will require 2 FTE. As a result of our success in the competitive WIP II funding phase, we have secured funding for program start-up and operations for three years. Additionally, we have sought inclusion of the faculty costs through the Wyoming Investment in Nursing (WYIN) program through the Wyoming Community College Commission.

BUDGET IMPACT:

Outside funding to establish and sustain this program for three years has been secured through WIP. Additional funding support has been applied for through WYIN. We expect the budgetary impact for implementation of this credential to be minimal.

supplies)	STAFFING IMPACT: The PN program will require 2 full-time FTE to sustain a free-standing PN program. Our intention is to hire 1 FT - FTE for didactic/theory instruction and course coordination along with 1 FTE to facilitate lab/clinical rotations. The current requirement in the state of Wyoming for instructor: student ratio remains 1 instructor to 8 students. We hope to admit 16 students in the fall of '24 requiring the 2 FT FTE to cover the program.
	BUDGET IMPACT: This project relies on WIP funding for program development and start up. In the (approved) WIP II proposal we sought three years of funding to address program start-up costs to include equipment and supplies, as well as the costs associated with instruction. We anticipate moving all appropriate costs to the College's budget for the FY27. Additionally, the College will seek funds through the Wyoming Investment in Nursing (WyIN) program for costs associated with the PN faculty salaries. The opportunity to express this request to the Wyoming Community College Commission will be April 2023, and this expense will be proposed in the biennial budget in the 2024 legislative session with anticipated funding July 1, 2024. One FTE faculty salary will be requested for every increase of 8 PN students.
