Table 1R2c-2 provides program review summary information over three years from that reveals a trend of increased program use of process mechanisms that ensure program curriculum and competencies sustain rigor and respond to stakeholder needs (from 2.0 mechanisms to 3.0).

Based on the below data the Institutional Effectiveness Department is setting an <u>internal target</u> for Per Program Average of Mechanisms Used at 3.0.
