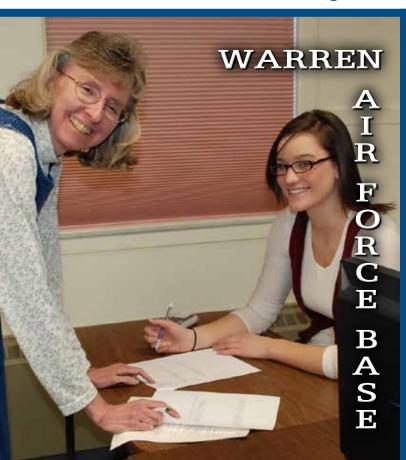


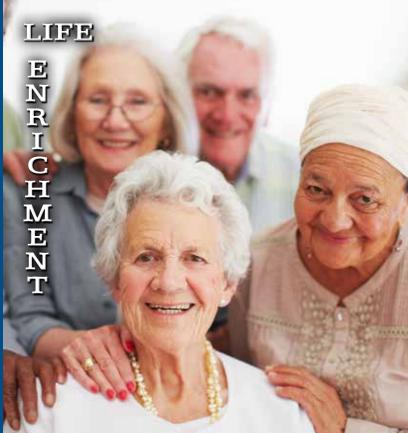

This schedule of classes is not a contract, and the college does not assume liability for errors in scheduling. Please inform the college of any errors by calling any of the contact phone numbers listed.

The college reserves the right to cancel any class that does not have sufficient enrollment to cover expenses. The decision to cancel is usually made two days before the first class meeting, and every effort is made to notify registered students promptly. A full refund is processed automatically unless the student decides to transfer to another class or section of a canceled class. Registering at least two weeks before a class begins helps avoid unnecessary cancellations. In order to ensure class enrollment, students should register with payment no later than two days prior to the start of a class. (Life Enrichment and Business Training will take enrollments up to the starting date of the course.) Students who wish to drop a class must do so no later than two days prior to the start of the class.

Guidelines

- There are a minimum number of people who must be enrolled before a class can be held.
 (This number varies depending on the course.)
 LCCC offers students 60 years of age and older the privilege of enrolling for credit courses at a cost of \$10 per credit hour. However, other fees such as labs, records, etc., must be paid. A grade point average of 2.0 or higher must be maintained to enroll for credit courses.
- The instructor or the program manager will notify (to the best of their ability) all students if a course is canceled.
- Anyone with an idea for a course is urged to contact Outreach & Workforce Development by calling 307.778.1236.

Personal Protection in the Home

The goal of this course is to develop the students' basic knowledge, skills and attitude essential to the safe and efficient use of a handgun for protection of self and family. The course will also provide information on the lawabiding citizen's right to self-defense. Students must provide 200 rounds and their own .38 caliber or larger (non-magnum) center-fire handguns. Ammunition must be factory-loaded, full metal jacket design (no reloads). Continued participation in this class will require a student to demonstrate safe handling skills and complete a shooting proficiency evaluation with his/her handgun during the first class session. Students must present proof of participation (a signed certificate of completion) in either the LCCC/LCSD Basic Pistol Course or the NRA Basic Pistol Course on the first night and prior to admission into this class. Any firearms brought to the course will be unloaded prior to entering the LCSD Building. Ammunition and firearms must be carried in separate containers. This course is for law-abiding adult citizens (minimum age is 21). A criminal history check will be done by the Sheriff's Department prior to the start of the class.

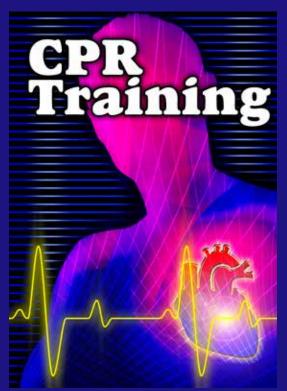

The Adult Career and Education System (ACES) provides day and evening classes in Adult Basic Education (ABE), High School Equivalency Certificate (HSEC) preparation, Adult Secondary Education (ASE), and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL). The classes are noncredit and available for residents 16 years of age or older. ACES is open fall, spring, and summer semesters.

ACES is located in the Career and Technical Building on the main LCCC campus. ABE and ESOL services are also provided at the Eastern Laramie County Outreach Center in Pine Bluffs. Call for class times, to schedule orientation or for additional information.

Adult Basic Education (ABE)

ABE provides instruction for those students wanting to upgrade their basic reading, writing, and math literacy skills.

High School Equivalency Certificate (HSEC) Preparation

Instruction is provided to prepare students to complete the High School Equivalency Certificate (HSEC). Classes include reading, writing, math, science, social studies, and college and career transitions. Students who are 16 or 17 years of age must complete age waiver requirements through ACES prior to taking the tests.

Adult Secondary Education (ASE)

ASE provides instruction for students who have their high school diploma or equivalent and want to improve their basic skills to upgrade their employment opportunities or pursue further education. Classes include reading, math, writing, and college transitions.

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

This program provides opportunities for students to reach their language goals such as understanding, speaking, reading and writing the English language. Students will become more integrated into society by learning about American culture, customs and the rights and responsibilities of citizenship. The classes are designed for the nonnative speaker of English.

Career Readiness Certificate

Students have the opportunity to earn a Career Readiness Certificate (CRC) to demonstrate their skills and potential to employers.

Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) is a program through which students in participating states may enroll in designated institutions and programs in other participating states at a special, reduced tuition level. Under the terms of this program, students can be admitted at a cost of 150 percent of resident tuition.

Participating in the Western Undergraduate Exchange are Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington and Wyoming. WUE rates are extended to Nebraska students by Wyoming community colleges.

LCCC will admit students from the above states to enter with the WUE designation. Proof of residence will be the same as currently in place for all LCCC students. Students from any participating state may enroll in any program at LCCC provided all other admission requirements are met.

Deferred Tuition and Fee Payment Plan

Students may elect to pay their tuition and fees through the college's deferred payment plan. Tuition will be refunded based on a predetermined schedule. Students must submit a change of enrollment form to the college to officially withdraw from any course. **The effective date of change is the date the form is received by the college.** For more information, call 307.778.1139.

Auditing Courses

Students who wish to enroll in a course for informational purposes only may audit that course. Students may repeat an audited course later for credit by registering for the course and paying tuition and any applicable fees. The tuition and any fees for an audited course are the same as they would be if the course were taken for credit. The decision to audit a course should be made at registration; however, students may elect to change to audit if the following procedure is observed:

- 1. For a 15- to 16-week course, students may change a course from credit to audit at any time prior to the end of the ninth week of the semester by following the standard procedure for a schedule change.
- For courses fewer than 15 weeks in length, including summer school, the deadline for changing from audit to credit is the midpoint of the course.
- 3. Students may only change a course from audit to credit prior to the final date on which a course may be added.

Any student enrolled in a course for audit should clarify the requirements with the instructor before enrolling or on the first day of class. If there are course requirements for which an audit student is unprepared or unwilling to meet, he or she may drop the course immediately subsequent to the first class period and receive a full tuition refund. An audit student who is not willing to meet the stated course requirements and does not drop the course immediately subsequent to the first class period may be withdrawn from the class at any time by the instructor for failing to meet stated requirements.

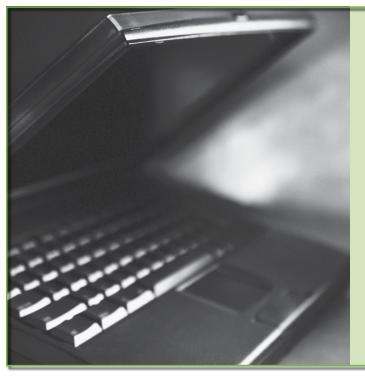

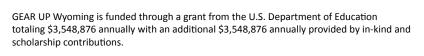

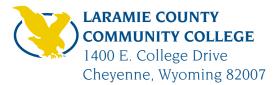
